# HOW DO <u>YOU</u> KNOW IT'S SUMMER?

After reading **How Do You Know It's Summer?** have a discussion with the children about what they notice and do that's summery: clothes, activities, warmer weather, plant life.

You can write down each of their responses, including some from the book, and make a summer mural, or individual pages to put into a class book. It is especially good to talk about the fun you can have close to home/daycare, during the summer.

#### **SUMMER: TIME TO PLAY**

Children can spend hours playing in sand and/or water. If you do not have a sand/water table, you can substitute a very large plastic bin, available in many outlet stores or craft stores (like "under-the-bed" boxes). Fill with a couple of bags of play sand, available from hardware and home improvement stores. Make a variety of plastic containers, shovels, rakes, pouring toys, cars, and trucks available to the children. Lather them up with sunscreen and/or provide some shade. *Alternative*: fill with water and bubbles, pouring toys, and boats.

**CHALK GAMES \*** 

Set up the following games with sidewalk chalk:

FOR YOU: a copy of these activities is available in back of this notebook.

- Squiggly lines for children to balance on.
- Small square path for children to jump along.
- Giant square for children to jump in and out of; or bounce a ball into and out of.
- Tracks to ride vehicles on.
- Straight or curvy lines to kick a ball along.
- Giant shapes to toss beanbags into.

Alternative: Make a chalk village. Let the children take out small cars, trucks, boats, planes, and people to play with. Let them help design and draw the village and environs.

# BUSY BEES: FUN FOR (MORE THAN) TWO'S AND THREE'S

While the adult resource says it is for 2 and 3 year olds, there are many fabulous activities that your older children will enjoy too. Take a look at "Ants" (p. 54-55): observing ants outdoors, moving like ants, ant poems and an "ant" snack. Or "Wheels" (p. 80-81), with a counting activity, a parade on wheels, rhymes and songs. These will be fun for everyone.

#### STORY BOOK PICNIC

Take a blanket, towel, or sheet and a basket of books outside (but don't forget them!) You can read one, or let everybody pick a favorite and lounge around on the blanket "reading". We've all known the pleasure of lying leisurely in the sun with a good book!

#### **FIVE LITTLE DUCKS**

Puppets included in this kit can be used with this poem. Also put on the Rise and Shine CD and let children use them that way.

You may want to make a mother duck to go with the little ones, using the pattern included in this notebook.

Five little ducks went out to play
Over the hill and far away.
Mother Duck said, "Quack quack quack "
And four little ducks came waddling back.
And three, two, one, no ...

No little ducks came out to play Over the hill and far away.

Mother Duck said, "Quack quack quack"
And five little ducks came waddling back!



#### SUNFLOWER CRAFT IDEAS

Bring in a real sunflower, available in the summer where flowers and produce are sold. Talk about its different parts: stem, petals, center full of seeds.

Then make your own flowers using any of the following materials:

- yellow or white paper plates
- paper towel rolls for stems
- real sunflower seeds to glue into the center of the flower
- yellow and green construction paper for petals and leaves

#### -Fingerplays and Action Rhymes-

#### THIS IS THE WAY WE PLANT

To tune of Mulberry Bush, to sing and act out.

This is the way we plant the seeds, etc. This is the way we rake the garden, etc. This is the way we pull the weeds, etc. This is the way we water the plants, etc. This is the way we harvest the ... carrots, etc.

This is the way we wash the carrots, etc. This is the way we eat the carrots, etc.

#### **MY GARDEN**

Fingerplay or full body action rhyme. For full body, suit actions to words.

This is my garden
I'll rake it with care
And then some flower seeds
I'll plant there.
The sun will shine
And the rain will fall.
My garden will blossom
And grow straight and tall.

#### **FIVE PRETTY SUNFLOWERS**

Five pretty sunflowers are standing In the sun

Hold up 5 fingers

Now their heads are nodding

Bend fingers slightly

And bowing one by one.

Down, down, down, down,

Comes the gentle rain.

Raise hands, wiggle fingers for gently falling rain.

And the five pretty sunflowers

Lift up their heads again.

Hold up 5 fingers again.

Repeat, with all ten fingers this time.

### FIVE SUNFLOWERS

The children can act this out, using sunflowers made from paper plates with the middle cut out and yellow petals drawn or pasted around the outside edge. Make a "sun" plate, and rain streamers to come in on cue. The sunflowers begin crouched down low.

Five little sunflowers growing in the ground,

Five little sunflowers yellow and brown,

The sun began to shine,

The rain began to fall,

Five little sunflowers grew up tall.



As fingerplay

One hand out, palm up Rake fingers of other hand over Push finger "into" palm, planting several. Two hands circle for sun Fingers rain down. Using fists for "blossoms", open and raise high above head.
